

Welcome to the *Clinton Neighborhood*

Schools: The neighborhood's namesake is the historic Clinton Elementary School, an educational tradition for generations of Clinton families. Clinton Elementary has a diverse student population and a variety of special programs to meet individual learning needs. Sacred Heart, a Catholic elementary school, also serves neighborhood children. Clinton Middle School students attend Culler Middle School and high school students attend Lincoln Northstar High School.

Recreational Opportunities: The University of Nebraska's two campuses border the neighborhood on the east and west. The John Dietrich Bike Trail runs along Clinton's northern boundary, and the Mo-Pac West Trail is being completed along the southern edge. Playground equipment can be found in the neighborhood's many parks – Pentzer, Lintel, Nevin and Woodside. Open space is maintained for such activities as baseball, soccer and football at Lintel and Pentzer Parks. A basketball court is also available at Pentzer Park. The Salvation Army offers youth activities, basketball courts, pool tables and electronic games.

Businesses: An active business district along 27th Street boasts restaurants, drugstores, bicycle shop, outdoor clothing, Cornhusker Bank, furniture, and service and convenience businesses. Additional businesses including convenience stores, automotive repair and salvage, movie sales and rentals, and a collectibles shop, are located on North 33rd Street.

Public Transportation: Three *StarTran* bus lines connect to downtown and other parts of the city. For route information, call (402)476-1234.

Churches: There are six churches located in the neighborhood, and many others are within easy walking distance.

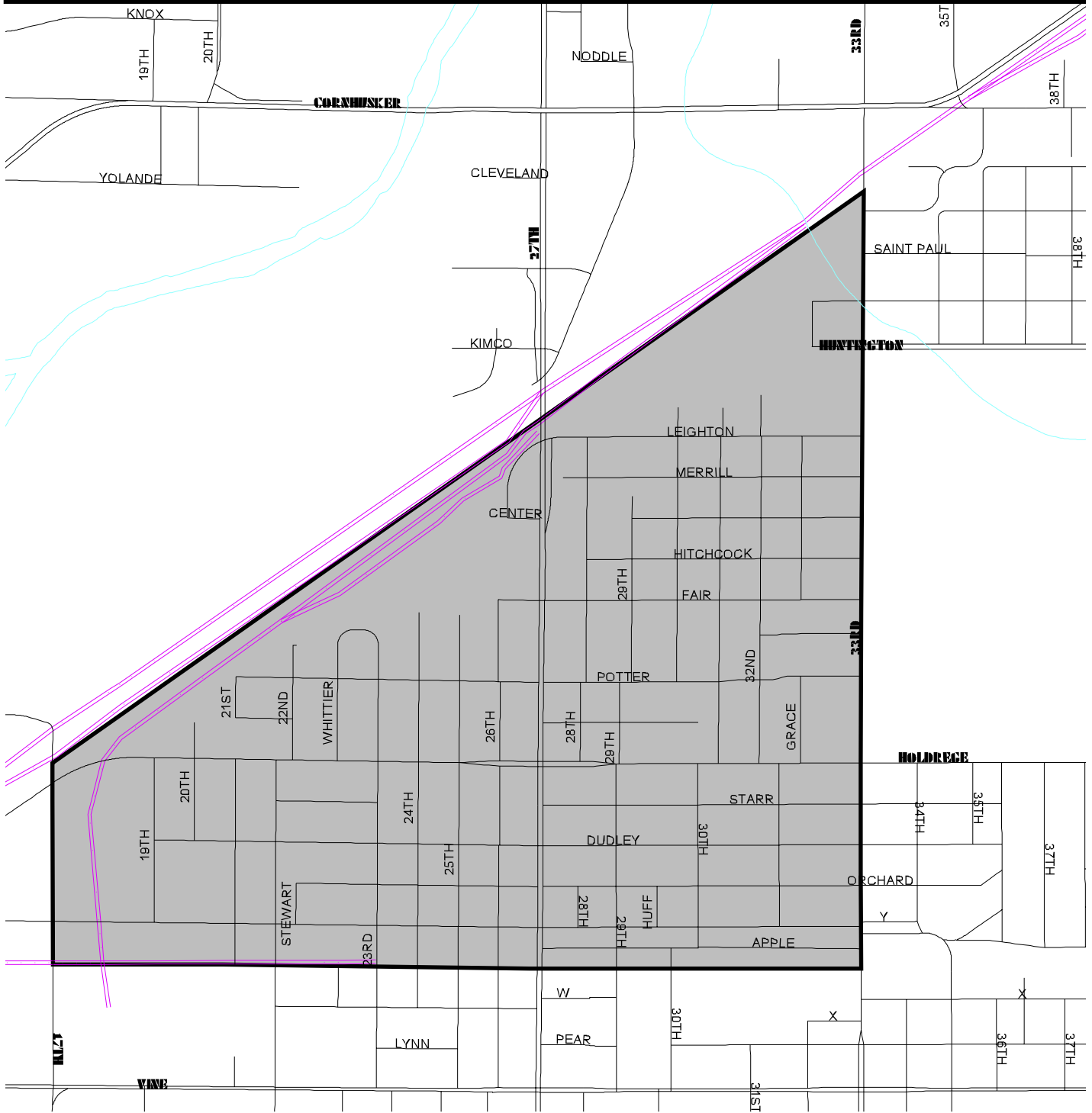

Services: *People's Health Center* at 1021 North 27th St. offers health and dental services regardless of family income. Those who qualify receive services free or at reduced rates. The *Good Neighbor Community Center* at 2617 Y St. provides food, clothing, referral services, and self-help group counseling to individuals and families in need. The *Salvation Army* at 2625 Potter St. and *Northbridge Community Center-Cedars* at 1533 North 27th St. also provide a variety of social services including food, utility assistance, transportation and child care.

Historic Points of Interest: Built in 1909 at 27th & Orchard St. and moved in 1992 to a new site south of the 27th St. viaduct, the 'Carnegie Library' (as it is best known), is the neighborhood's most historically significant structure. The building now houses *NeighborWorks® Lincoln.*, a non-profit organization that helps low to moderate-income residents buy homes. Some of Clinton's most stately houses were built along Holdrege St. in the early 1900's so that residents would have access to the electric trolley that operated down that busy thoroughfare. Some of those beautiful homes still grace the street today.

Neighborhood Activities: The Clinton Neighborhood Organization has been active since 1967. It sponsors an annual cleanup and home improvement programs, publishes a neighborhood newsletter, and is an active voice in city development issues affecting the area.
