

Welcome to the *Everett* *Neighborhood*

Location/Transportation: Location and close proximity is one reason many people choose to live in Everett. Everett is within biking or walking distance to the University of Nebraska's city campus and Southeast Community College's downtown campus, government offices, art galleries, Downtown and the Historic Haymarket entertainment districts. Public transportation is also easily accessible to residents as they have several choices of bus services. The Downtown *StarTran* Shuttle stops at 11th & G St. every 10 minutes for downtown and UNL commuters. Bus service is available on 9th, 10th, and 13th Sts. every 1/2 hour during peak times and every hour off-peak. For more information, call (402) 476-1234.

Schools: The three schools serving Everett children have recent building additions and boast all the amenities of the newer, outlying Lincoln schools. In addition, Everett neighborhood schools have a diverse student population and teaching staff. Everett Elementary is the only school within the Lincoln Public School system that offers a Montessori program preschool through 5th grade.

Businesses: Everett has several small business districts located primarily along 13th, South, and 11th & G Sts. Most of the businesses in the neighborhood are family-owned and offer a wide array of goods and services from ethnic grocery stores, pharmacy, restaurants, pet grooming, fine wines, print shops, hair salons, vacuum repair and heating stoves.

Historic Points of Interest: Everett is part of the original plat of Lincoln and is rich in history. A few of the neighborhood structures listed on the National Register or as Lincoln Landmarks are: Bahr and Lyman Terrace at 11th & H St., built in 1889; Albert Watkins House at 920 D St., built in 1887; and James Calhoun House at 1130 Plum St., built in 1889.

Recreational Opportunities: The F Street Recreation Center at 13th and F Sts. serves as a hub for many activities. It caters to an active senior population and neighborhood youth. The downtown YWCA and YMCA also offer opportunities for a good work-out. Cooper, Wilderness, and Pioneers Parks are located nearby to meet other recreational needs. Also within close proximity are the Children's Museum, Folsom Children's Zoo and the Sunken Gardens.

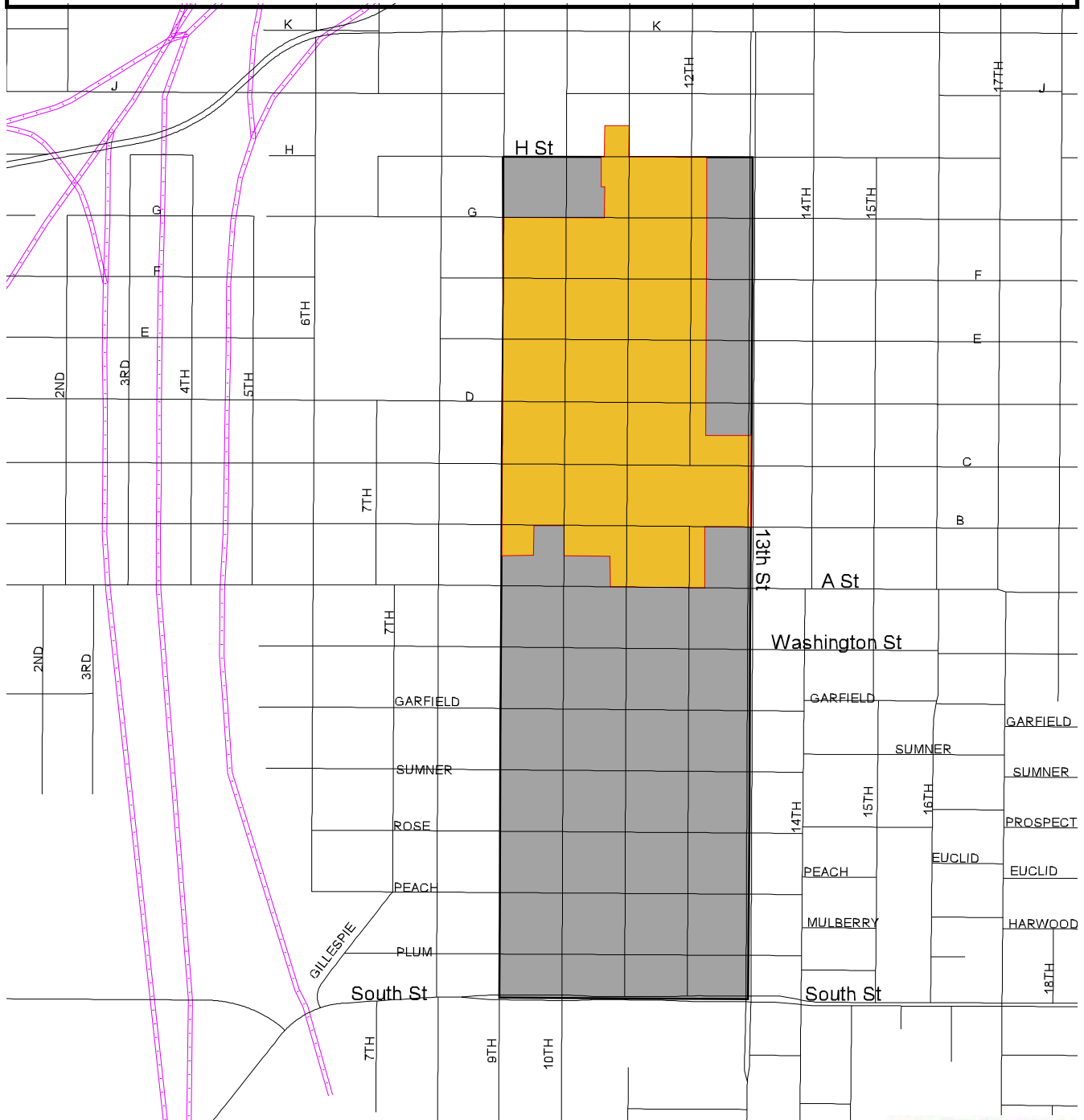
Churches: Five churches are located in Everett and many more are within an easy commute.

Services: F Street Community Center offers an array of classes and services such as: martial arts, Spanish and cooking classes. It also sponsors an after school program and a variety of youth clubs. Everett Elementary and Park Middle School have after school programs. Neighborhood churches sponsor food net one day a week. Everett is also home to the Neighborhood Service Exchange at 1036 E St. This is a unique service in which residents who are members of the exchange trade services.

Neighborhood Activities: The Everett Neighborhood Association has been active since 1985. The association recently down zoned much of the neighborhood in order to preserve the housing stock and encourage rehabilitation of older houses. Annually, the neighborhood association conducts a spring plant sale, neighborhood clean-up, tree planting, and Christmas/holiday decorations contest. Newsletters are delivered door-to-door four times a year.
