**Recreational Opportunities:** For a traditional family day, Hayward Park at 9th & Military Road offers picnic shelters, playground equipment, a baseball/softball field and basketball court. Within easy walking distance of the neighborhood is Oak Lake Park where you can enjoy the playground, fish, exercise on the jog/bike path, have a picnic, float your remote control boat, ice skate, and snowmobile. For cycling enthusiasts, the BMX Dirt Bike Trail at 1st & Charleston Streets provides thrills and spills. The Salt Creek Levee Trail allows direct access as far as Bison Trail and Pioneer Park. The Rifle Range at 10th & Military Road offers shooting classes, matches, and an open shoot. The number there is (402)441-7952. Other entertainment options are available nearby including the State Fair Park, Bob Devaney Sports Center, UNL City Campus, the unique ambience of the Historic Haymarket, and the excitement of Lincoln's new professional Haymarket Baseball Park.

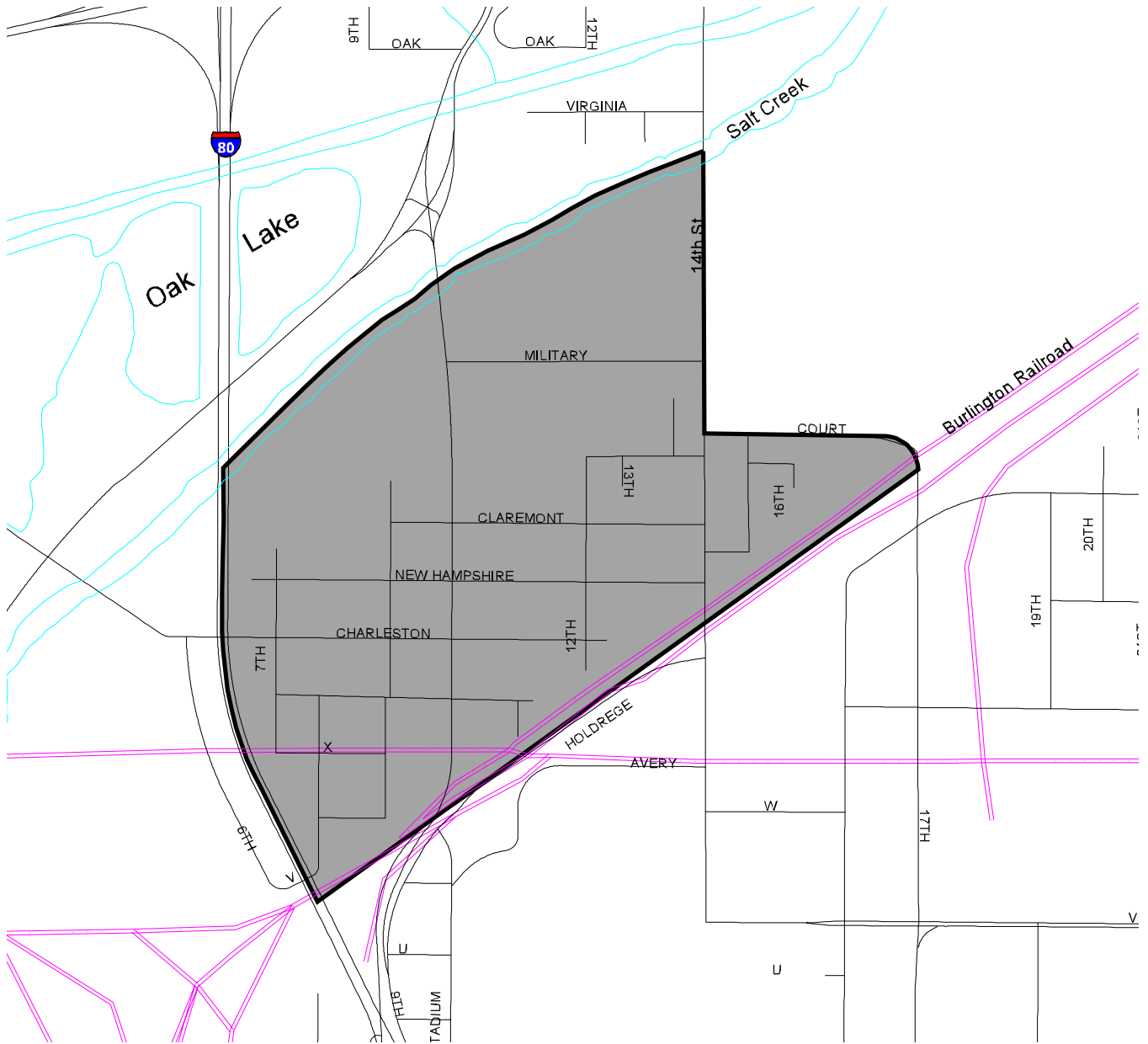

**Historic Points of Interest:** The neighborhood maintains a summer kitchen and historic museum in a restored building at 1136 New Hampshire. Contents include household items, German books, artifacts from Hayward Elementary School and other neighborhood memorabilia. An oral history of the area produced in a slide or tape format is available for group presentations. There is also a North Bottoms historic landmark and mini park at 10th & Charleston Streets.

**Neighborhood Activities:** The North Bottoms Neighborhood Association organizes various projects. They include an annual garage sale, annual cleanup, grants to improve Hayward Park and promote housing rehabilitation, and a quarterly newsletter.
