

Welcome to the *Woods Park* *Neighborhood*

Schools: Elliott Elementary, located on the western edge of the Woods Park neighborhood, has been called an 'international school' because of its rich diversity. Randolph Elementary, which serves students living on the east side of the neighborhood, is a K-6th grade building offering a wide range of programs for gifted and special needs students. A Catholic elementary school, St. Teresa's, also serves neighborhood children. Secondary school students attend Leffler Middle School and Lincoln High School.

Recreational Opportunities: Three parks: Woods, Neighbors, and the American Legion, are located in the neighborhood. Residents can swim in either the Woods Park or Antelope Park municipal pools, play indoor or outdoor tennis at the Woods Tennis Center, pedal on scenic bike paths bordering the neighborhood, play softball and soccer, walk to the Children's Zoo, stroll through the Sunken Garden and ski cross-country in Woods or Antelope Parks. Lincoln Gym, a membership facility, offers indoor recreational activities.

Services: Several non-profit organizations located in the neighborhood provide a variety of helpful services. These include the Lincoln/Lancaster County Health Dept, Asian Community Center, RSACC, the Lighthouse (a supervised, supportive environment for young people), and Haven Manor, an assisted living center.

Churches: Two churches are located in the neighborhood and more than ten others are within easy walking distance.

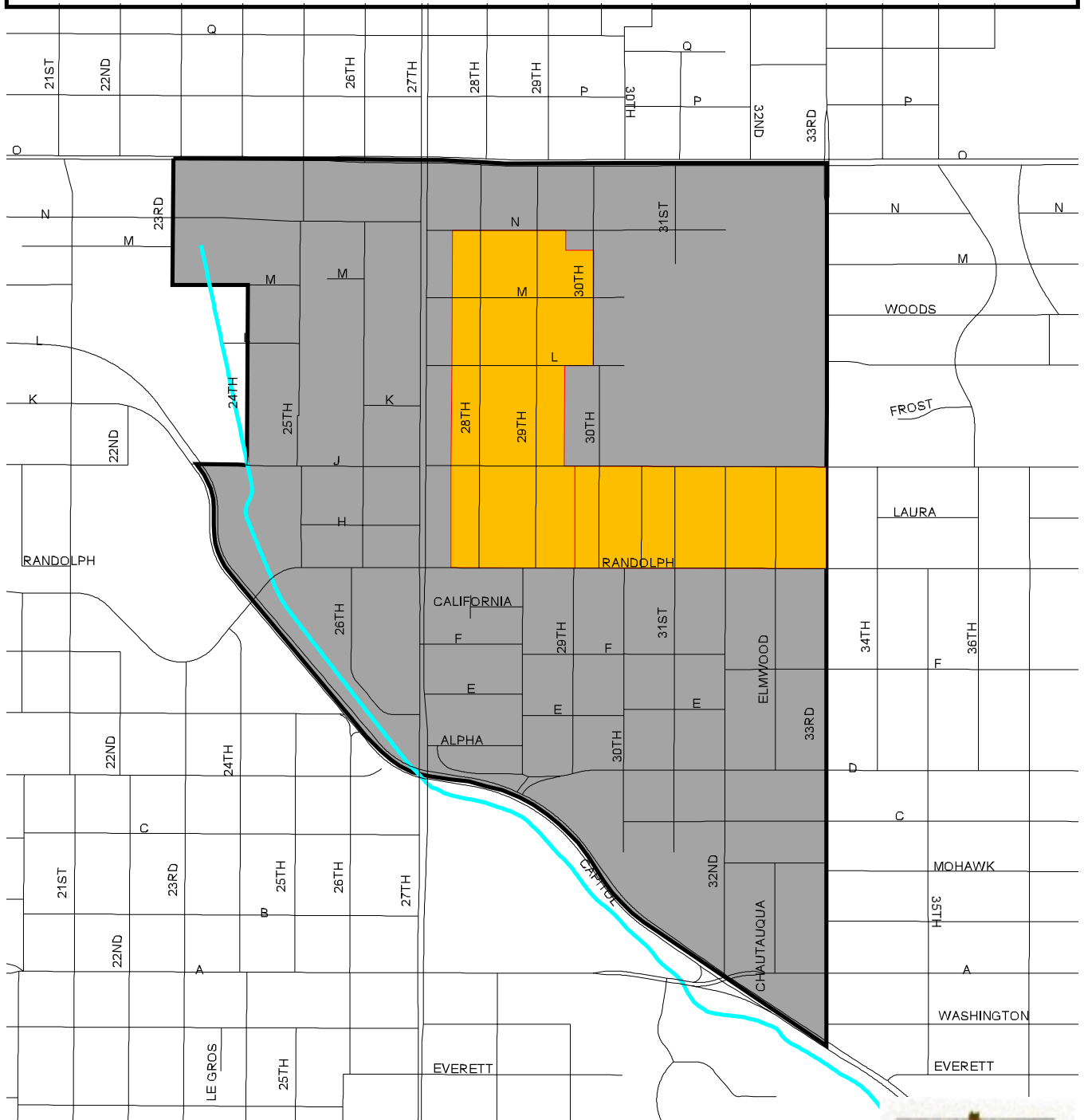
Businesses: When you live in the Woods Park neighborhood, you can walk for your groceries, flowers, haircut, breakfast, dental appointment, hardware, and dry cleaning. A bike shop can help you keep your two-wheeled transportation in top shape and Gates automotive caters to four-wheeled vehicles. An active business district along 27th Street includes a consignment shop, the classic Ideal Grocery, a drive through coffee shop, and the expanding Paramount Laundry.

Public Transportation: No less than four *StarTran* bus lines link the neighborhood with other parts of the city. For route information, call (402) 476-1234..

Historic Points of Interest: The neighborhood is home to two historic districts and several historic landmarks including the Murphy-Sheldon House (now Northrup Design) at 2525 N Street and Antelope Grocery (now Reynolds Kitchens) at 24th & J Streets.

Neighborhood Activities: The Woods Park Neighborhood Association is an active force for neighborhood improvement. It helps gravel alleys, installs park lighting, promotes housing rehab programs, and plants trees. It sponsors an annual cleanup and publishes a newsletter to keep residents informed about the issues that affect the area.
